We are a community-based service providing quality Vacation Care with action-packed programs that children will enjoy.

Our experienced educators are enthusiastic, friendly and supportive to every child's needs. They provide a safe and caring environment linking to key learning outcomes.

OPEN HOURS

Chancellor OSHC Vacation Care hours are 6:30am-6:30pm

COSTS & FEES

\$83.50 per day with **INCURSION**.

\$62.60 per day that has **NO INCURSION**.

EXCURSION No excursions this vacation.

EXCURSIONS

NOTE: for any excursions, children must be registered in OSHC prior to organising for departure. Children who are late for stated arrive time, or who are dropped off at the departure area will NOT be able to go on the excursion. Check schedule for food needs and other requirements.

FOOD AT OSHC

The service provides breakfast (7:00am to 8:00am), morning tea, afternoon tea and a late snack. Check excursion days for BYO snacks and/or lunch! Chancellor OSHC follows Queensland Health's Nutritional Standards for Meals and Menus.

BYO LUNCH BOX - If bringing lunch from home, there is no heating or cooking available. Also, no nuts or whole egg.

LUNCH ORDER AT OSHC

Chancellor OSHC offers a Lunch menu. Cost is \$7.00 and your child will receive a hot main meal, dessert and popper. Place your order by using Qkr! app.

BOOKINGS: HOW TO MAKE YOUR VACATION CARE BOOKING ON OWNA

ALL bookings are done via the OWNA App.

Bookings **OPEN** March 10. Bookings **CLOSE** March 20 (for staff rosters to be prepared).

After March 20 if you require a booking, email your request to oshc@cscspandc.org.au - places will be allocated depending on child/educator ratios.

TO BOOK: Open the OWNA App:

1. Press the + icon.
2. Select Casual Bookings (all vacation care bookings are casual).
3. Select Vacation Care Room, OR, select EXCURSION if your child will be going on an excursion that is scheduled on that day.
4. Select the week and child, you would like to book for.
5. Chose from the available days (in Green) . If you are booking for multiple children, you can see how many spots are available.
6. Press Book Selected to confirm.

If there are no spots available, you can click the bell icon to be notified if a spot opens up.

CANCELLATIONS

We require 7 days notice, via an email, for a cancellation of fees. Once we receive an email, we will adjust the attendance and you will not be charged.

If your child is not attending within the 7 day time frame, we kindly ask you to use your OWNA Parent App to mark your child as Not Attending. There is no need to email us for less than 7 days notice. You will still be charged for this booking.

MEDICATION

CHANCELLOR OSHC INCURSION PROVIDER INFORMATION

At Chancellor OSHC we follow the My Time, Our Place Framework for school aged care, part of the Australian Government's National Quality Framework. We choose all our activities, including our incursions with the My Time Our Place (MTOPI) Outcomes in mind. Read about our external Incursion providers and benefits for our children and see the outcomes for the incursions planned.

Outcome 1: Children have a strong sense of identity. They feel safe, secure, and supported. They develop their autonomy, inter-dependence, resilience and sense of agency. Children develop knowledgeable and confident self-identities. Children learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect.

Outcome 2: Children are connected with and contribute to their world. They develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and an understanding of the reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary for active community participation. Children respond to diversity with respect. Children become aware of fairness. They become socially responsible and show respect for the environment.

Outcome 3: Children have a strong sense of wellbeing. They become strong in their social and emotional wellbeing. Children take increasing responsibility for their own health and physical wellbeing. Children become confident and involved learners through music and moving.

Outcome 4: Children are confident, involved learners. They develop dispositions such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity. They use a range of skills and processes such as problem solving, inquiry, experimentation, hypothesising, researching and investigating. Children transfer and adapt what they have learned from one context to another. Children resource their own learning through connecting with people, place, technologies and natural and processed materials.

Outcome 5: Children are effective communicators. Children interact verbally and non-verbally with others for a range of purposes. Children engage with a range of texts and gain meaning from these texts. Children collaborate with others, express ideas and make meaning using a range of media and communication technologies.
